DPRK Threatens Nuclear Test, Demands Giant Rabbits

The DPRK announced last Friday night their intentions to test a nuclear warhead in an undisclosed underground location today at 2:00 pm.

They make several demands, including the opening of diplomatic relations with the US, the lifting of sanctions, the finished construction of a light water reactor, and ten giant rabbits

for Kim Jong-Il's state dinner party. They note Mr. Bill Clinton may or may not be attending.

"The DPRK feels silenced and excluded from the recent proceedings, and thus resort to force in order to be heard and to have its demands met," said their delegation.

Political analysts at the Truthiness Express have doubts over the potential success of the test, given the fizzle of their 2006 test.



Attack on Bushehr

Israel Shaken over Iran's Walk Out
