

DPRK Claims 10 Kiloton 'Peaceful' Test

The Democratic People's Republic of Korea has carried out a peaceful nuclear explosion, an international watchdog group confirms. North Korean diplomats claim a 10-kiloton explosion, but this cannot yet be confirmed.

This explosion appears to have been more successful than the fizzle that was their 2006 nuclear weapons test, judging from the seismic activity measured and the unique shape of the cloud.

Japan, a close neighbor of the DPRK says, "The attempts to destabilize the region are especially abhorrent. We will take the necessary steps to secure our country."

A representative from the US tells us, "The United States continues to be disappointed in North Korea's irresponsible attempts to derail these negotiations."



American Spy Detained in Bushehr

An undercover spy from the US was caught engaging in dubious activities in an Iranian nuclear facility.

Gen. Ivan Gorbachova, Russian director of the facility, came upon the spy when he had stayed late at work for a nightcap and discovered the American mole attempting to lift sensitive information from classified records. Cooking Corner: Giant Rabbit Stew

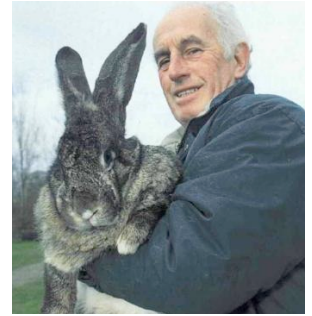
(and a shout out to our friend Kim Jung Il. Invite us to your dinner party!)
