

Honorable moderators, fellow delegates and esteemed guests,  
Good afternoon. The People's Republic of China is extremely honored and excited to work with you today. China has demonstrated a considerable commitment to nuclear nonproliferation. We come in peace. Our efforts towards nuclear nonproliferation include our participation in the Nuclear Suppliers Group and our facilitation of Six Party Talks. China promises to continue to contribute to international nuclear nonproliferation efforts. In today's negotiations China's chief priorities are to

1. Preclude any military engagements between states
2. Obtain clear and convincing information on Iran's nuclear capabilities, specifically technologies that can only be used for nuclear weapon development.
3. Maintain international peace and stability
4. Foster candid and constructive multilateral dialogue
5. Prevent the proliferation of nuclear weapons

Most importantly, China is eager to mediate between conflicting nations. China will endeavor to understand the interests, concerns and intentions of all participating nations. China has strong ties with both the United States of America and the Islamic Republic of Iran. As such China is uniquely positioned to foster open dialogue between the two states for the impending nuclear crisis.

China understands why the U.S.A. and Israel are concerned with Iran's nuclear intentions and capabilities. It is not too unreasonable for the U.S. and Israel to suspect Iran of nuclear weapons development. It is however unreasonable for nations to accuse Iran of such behavior. China believes that in order to foster open dialogue with Iran the U.S. should refrain from instigating further sanctions against Iran. China would however like to remind both Iran and the U.S. that China has supported two mild sanctions against Iran. That being said, China is still very much committed to being a mediator for both nations. To our friend Iran, China will advocate for you but China calls for increased Iranian cooperation and transparency with the IAEA. China does not appreciate Iran's mixed signals.

China would like to give a shout out to her comrades, the D.P.R.K. and Russia. To the D.P.R.K.: China requests your cooperation and good will. To Russia: China hopes that her Russian comrades will synchronize their stance with China's. China would be honored to share her role as a mediator with Russia.

China encourages delegates to bicker and banter but only in the name of peaceful foreign diplomacy; and to respect every nation's sovereignty and right to peaceful nuclear technology.
