

We would like to first say that we recognize the Islamic Republic of Iran's right to develop civilian nuclear technology. This proposal directed toward Iran is being written in order to ensure to the international community (officially including, but not exclusive to, the UK, France, Russia, China) that The Islamic Republic of Iran's current regime is interested in nuclear technology only for civilian purposes. We demand that Iran definitively demonstrate to the international community at large that they do not intend to create nuclear weapons. Iran can do this, at the same time ensuring multilateral support of their development of their civilian nuclear program, by agreeing to the following:

1. Cessation of uranium enrichment for the next two years. This involves agreeing to obtain uranium only by sending it first to Russia who will then send it to France for conversion of enriched uranium into fuel rods. At the end of two years, talks will resume on whether or not Iran can resume uranium enrichment.
2. Iran will never build any heavy water reactors.
3. Significantly increased transparency to the extent necessary to demonstrate the sole intentions of Iran to develop a civilian nuclear program, including bringing Iran back to full compliance with Code 3.1 of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty. They must also clarify the issue of the Qom reactor and the military involvement in their nuclear energy program. A greater breadth of countries represented in the strict inspection process is needed to help quell suspicions of purely western interests in the IAEA.
4. If full compliance is shown, all economic sanctions removed immediately and other sanctions phased out over 10 years if good behavior has been demonstrated.
5. Future failures to cooperate with the IAEA or violations of the NPT will result in severe implications against Iran.
6. As a gesture of goodwill and working towards the eventual goal of global disarmament, France and China will agree to reduce their nuclear arsenals over the next 7 years to the level of the nuclear arsenal of the United Kingdom.
