

To the Pakistani delegation,

Dear delegates: The following days offer multiple opportunities for achieving the goals to strengthen our proud country and thwart the efforts of our opponents in the East. My instructions to you:

1. The issue of Kashmir is of prime importance to our country and our identity as a Muslim state. Seek the inclusion in any agreements a clause requiring a referendum in Kashmir and the withdrawal of Indian occupation forces from the region. Our plan against any Indian threat to the sovereignty of Pakistan must be made clear and emphasized in all plenary speeches and meetings with the Indian delegation. Any threat to the sovereignty of Pakistan, i.e. the invasion of our borders by Indian troops will result in nuclear force against any Indian troops in Pakistan.
2. Demand that the criminal regime in India dismantle its nuclear arsenals **completely**. Obviously, on no account can India be admitted to the NPT (unless it does so as a state free of nuclear weapons) nor should India be admitted as a permanent member of the Security Council, a position they have been aspiring to for decades.
3. Obviously, our own nuclear program, initiated in response to India's program and India's aggressions, **cannot** be affected by any negotiations. Our nuclear program is absolutely necessary to India's security, and strength in the region. We will not give up a single atom of plutonium or uranium. Although we may be persuaded to share technology if the price is right.
4. There is news that Engineering Resource Laboratories is attending this conference. Remind the representatives of the ERL that their organization was born and nurtured in Pakistan. Use this familial tie to gain information on their potential clients.
5. Remain non-committal in your stance on Iran's possible nuclear capability to begin with. Strengthen ties with Iran as necessary to achieve your goals. Iran may be looking for Muslim allies. Consider offering scientific aid to Iran's nuclear programs in exchange for Iranian support in preventing Indian influence in Afghanistan.
6. Suspect any overtures from Israel, a state that has never shown kindness to Islam. But do not preclude the option of secret ties with such states, depending on what you think you might gain from such ties.
