

France, Russia, The UK, and Iran recognize the need for multilateral cooperation on Iran's civilian nuclear energy. Given this concern France, the UK, and Russia (in consultation with Iran) propose to implement the following guidelines:

1. Russia will determine the enrichment level for all enrichment facilities. Iranian scientists and personnel will work with Russian specialists in the enrichment facilities.
2. All enriched uranium produced after this agreement will be sent to France for conversion into fuel rods. Those fuel rods will be sent back to Iran for use in the Tehran Research Reactor.
3. Russia will continue to supply fuel for the Bushehr Reactor.
4. The International Atomic Energy Association will conduct standard inspections as stated in the comprehensive safeguards established by the association. This includes all four types of inspections: (1) ad hoc inspections, (2) routine inspections, (3) special inspections, (4) safeguards visits. These inspections will begin in the following manner:
 - a. New IAEA inspections will not begin until 90 days have passed after the agreement. After that 90 day period, inspections will continue according to IAEA protocol.
 - b. All current IAEA inspections will continue as planned.
5. Until the arrival of Russian specialists after the ratification of this contract (90 days), Iran will suspend enrichment.
6. Should Israel attack Iran, the EU will cut off support to Israel. This promise would be contingent on the compliance of Iran with the agreement. Should Iran default, no attempt will be made by the US or the UK to interfere with an Israeli strike. Any militarily aggressive action by Iran towards Israel, defined as funding, planning, or initiating an attack, will cause the clause regarding cutting off support against Israel to lose all force. Should Iran default on this agreement, all existing and planned trade sanctions will resume, and all signatories will be free to apply any additional trade sanctions to Iran that they feel are appropriate.
7. No part of clause six should be seen or interpreted as depriving Israel of its right to self-defense against Iranian aggression.
8. Iran must give six months notice before backing out of the agreement. During this time, Russia and Switzerland will take a total inventory of Iran's nuclear material and facilities, a report to be made public to all nations at the conclusion of this inspection. All enriched uranium produced under this agreement of 20% or above would be sent to France for conversion into fuel rods and then sent back to Iran for use in the Tehran Research Reactor.
9. If Iran complies with all the aforementioned clauses, EU sanctions scheduled to go into effect July 1, 2012 will be annulled.
10. Any nuclear weapons on Iranian soil at this time will be removed and trusted to a neutral third party.
