

## Codebook for Pol210, Fall 2005

All variables have been recoded into the “public work area.” These variables should remain active for a few weeks. Please, if you decided to create new variables, name them something unique. You do have the ability to overwrite the variables shown below (anyone does). Below each variable is the source variable; you should check to make sure I did not make a mistake in coding.

<b>p210-didvote</b> (v5018x)	0=Did not vote 1=Did vote
<b>p210-Bushvote</b> (v5026)	0=Not vote for Bush 1=Vote for Bush
<b>p210-ftdiff</b>	p210-ftdiff=v5043-v5044 100 (pro Bush) to -100 (pro Kerry)
<b>p210-activism</b>	p210activism=(count(v5166,v5167,v5168,v5169,v5170(1)))/5 0 = no activity, 1=maximum activity in community
<b>p210-electactive</b>	p210-electactive=(count(v5010,v5011, v5012, v5013, v5014, v5015, v5016(1)))/7 0=no activity, 1=most activity
<b>p210-partymobil</b> (v5008)	0=Not contacted by party, 1=contacted by party
<b>p210-othermobil</b> (v5009)	0=not contacted by others, 1=contacted
<b>p210-black</b> (v3299)	0=not Black, 1=Black
<b>p210-hispanic</b> (v3299)	0=not Hispanic, 1=Hispanic
<b>p210-patriot</b>	Runs from 0 (least patriotic) to 1 (most patriotic) but is not a dummy variable. An index of the five patriotism measures.

Other variables of interest (with suggested recodes noted)

v3116(r:0-6)	Party ID: This limits the variable to only Str Dems to Str Reps.
V3250	Age
V3254	Education
V3293x(r:1-23)	Income (exclude those who refused)
